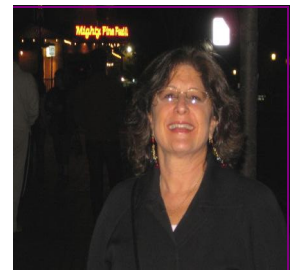
Reflections on the 2009 Summer Program, by Ashley Bates, Program Director
