**A few insights:**

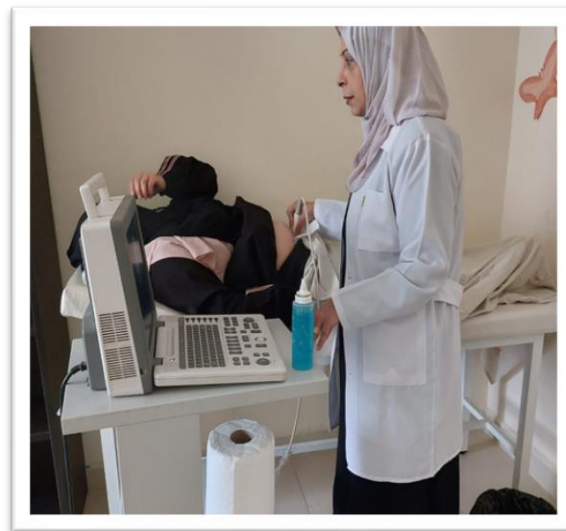




Our **Mother and Child Clinic** provided maternity services for women and their children. 3,500 women and children benefited from the clinic 's services during the reporting period.

### **Rapid Response Fund Appeal**

On October 7th, 2023, conflict between Hamas and Israel created a short-term crisis for families from Gaza Strip who were visiting Jordan for family reasons, or university students who is studying in Jordan and got stuck due to the boarder's closure and were not able to return to Gaza which forced them to stay in Jordan with no source of income. DSPR submitted a Rapid Response Fund to ACT alliance as an urgent response to the needs of Gazans people who left Gaza and got stuck in Jordan through Providing: emergency medical, health support for 100 families, cash assistance for three months for 115 families Awareness session on psychosocial support for 225 women, and cash for rent for 100 families for three months. DSPR Jordan continued its 3 years program supported by **Act Church of Sweden** titled **“Women Economic empowerment through Cooperatives”**. It targeted Palestinian refugee women at six refugee camps through providing them with needed training and skills to establish cooperatives and officially register these cooperatives to enable them work together to generate income for them and their families and eventually enhance their living conditions.



DSPR Jordan with its partner **ACT for Peace** Australia started the second phase of two years Graduation **out of Poverty “Forsa” Project** that identified 50 Palestinian and Syrian refugee households that are living in extreme poverty in the Gaza Camp, through a participatory approach based on a multidimensional assessment of their level of poverty and underlying vulnerabilities to be self reliance at the end of the project.





Kirk In Actie (**KIA**) as a donor and **DSPR** as an implementer have established **QUEST Recovering Businesses in 2018** targeting the refugees' entrepreneurs and local host entrepreneurs to restart and boost their SME's businesses. **QUEST** since 2018, funded pre-growth and operational SMEs in Jordan for economic growth, to maximize social impact between refugees and the hosting community, and to increase business maturity. 14 businesses benefited from this program till the end of 2024.



**QUEST is not only about money; it is about creating opportunities.**

DSPR Jordan entered Its third-year project with Its partner „**MOSAIC for the Middle East** “England through its center „Olive Tree House “for the poorest in eastern Amman, where Jordanians, Syrians, Iraqis, and others live in extremely poor conditions. Services include health, vocational training, non-formal education, trauma healing, psychosocial support, English and Music lessons, and direct assistance.





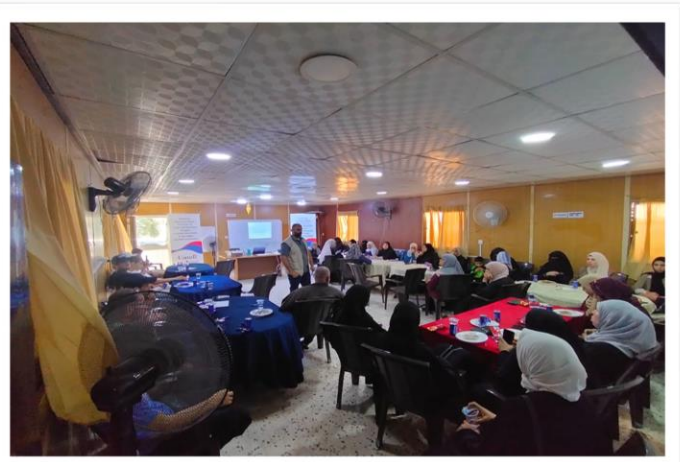
## What Is new?

DSPR Jordan supported by the Canadian Embassy in Amman, started a Community Cased Protection Program for Palestinian, Syrian Refugees and their Hosts to: Provide 30 heads of households with cash for protection, Conduct 2 open health days, one in Jerash camp and one in Souf camp to provide refugees and vulnerable host communities with free access to medical check-ups, consultations, referrals and treatment, Conduct community-based protection (CBP) awareness-raising, outreach workshops to help refugees and host community members self-identify protection risks and develop solutions.



## What next:

DSPR is to Lead in a multi-year Pilot Regional Appeal (Triple-Nexus Focus) in the MENA. The nexus approach integrates humanitarian, development, and peacebuilding efforts, aiming to provide comprehensive, sustainable solutions to the protracted and complex challenges in the region. This approach prioritizes: Addressing Immediate Needs: Rapid and effective responses to urgent humanitarian crises, Long-term Development: Fostering resilience through community-based projects and sustainable development initiatives, Peacebuilding Efforts: Promoting peace, social cohesion and stability through collaboration and mutual learning
